

World Youth Day Panama 2019 Subsidise on Offer

Street Parking Please be mindful and respectful when street parking your car when attending Mass. We have received a call from Fairfield Council stating residents have concerns in regards to vehicles parking in Stella Street obstructing vehicle access to/from residential properties on the weekends and some people are partially blocking driveways.

Under the NSW Road Rules, it is illegal to park a vehicle in a way that partially or completely blocks a driveway unless the driver is stopping briefly to drop off or pick up passengers. Site investigations have revealed that there are kerb spaces in Stella Street, which are insufficient to accommodate the parked vehicles.

Appropriate Enforcements will apply to vehicles obstructing driveways.
