

Who is Blessed Eusebius of Esztergom?

Celebrations will be advertised in the Bulletin.

Blessed Eusebius of Esztergom was born c. 1200AD in Esztergom. Hungary. He came from a well-known Hungarian family, with some evidence showing that he was a relative of the royal family of the Hungarian Kingdom. As a child, Eusebius had shown his deep religious faith and an ability to learn. He spent a lot of time in prayer and contemplation. He studied in the Seminary of Esztergom to become a priest. Later, he was named canon in Esztergom county, and showed compassion to the poor. In his spare time he wrote books, none of which have survived.

At that time Eusebius was often visited by hermits from the Pilis Mountains who sold him woven baskets in exchange for bread and other food. Eusebius also visited them personally several times. The life of these hermits aroused his interest and he desired to become a hermit but his plans were delayed by the Mongol invasion of Europe (1220-1240AD). He remained at his post, helping to rebuild the country.
