In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is' he had said, 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

### Parish Maintenance Program Update

Whilst this time of restricted movement during the Pandemic has meant that many church activities have come to a stop, the maintenance and upkeep of the Parish has continued. During the past weeks many maintenance works have been undertaken: installation of Internet connection to St. Benedict's Shrine, continued renovation of the Parish demountable buildings, installation and changing of lighting at St. Benedict's, plumbing works at St. Benedict's, extensive cleaning of St. Benedict's and St. Therese, improvements to the sound system at St. Therese, erection of fencing at St. Therese, and general maintenance such as gardening, cleaning, etc.

The rental property on The Boulevarde at Fairfield Heights has recently been vacated by the tenants and it has come to our attention that the property is in need of some urgent maintenance including removal of mould, repaint throughout and new guttering. The Montessori Academy on Oxford Street (child-care centre) is also in need of some major drainage maintenance. These will be conducted in the near future at quite an expense to the Parish.

Your continued support and generosity is very much appreciated, especially during this time where the Parish finances have come under extraordinary strain.

# <u>Information on the Gradual Re-Opening of Church Activities: Stage One.</u>

As you will be aware by now the Government has announced some revised regulations in regards to places of worship. Under the new guidelines, 20 mourners are allowed at an indoor funeral, 30 for an outdoor funeral. In addition <u>religious gatherings and places of worship can have up to 10 worshippers</u> at any one time. In line with these new regulations and on encouragement from Archbishop Anthony Fisher, we are proposing the following to come into effect on a <u>trial basis</u>, from <u>Monday 18<sup>th</sup> May, 2020 at St. Gertrude's Parish:</u>

- <u>St. Benedict's Shrine Smithfield</u> will be open for private prayer weekdays from 9am Noon (except if a funeral is booked then precedence will be given to the Funeral Service) and from 4pm-7pm. To accommodate this there will be volunteers who will remain in the church to ensure social distancing and hygiene protocols are followed. The pews that may be used will be clearly marked. We ask that you only use those places that are marked.
- <u>Confessions</u> Monday to Saturday **6pm to 7pm**. Please note, that those wishing to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation are included in the 10 worshippers.
- Mass times at St. Benedict's will remain as they are at present:

Mon – Fri
 8pm Mass streamed via Zoom with adoration at 7.30pm.

Saturday Vigil 6pm Mass streamed via Zoom

Sunday9am & 6pm Mass streamed via Zoom

Mass times at St. Therese Fairfield Heights

■ Mon – Fri **3pm** 

In accordance with Government guidelines, <u>each person who enters the church MUST give their name, telephone</u> <u>number and email address</u> (if they have one). There will be a sheet provided in the foyer of the church for this purpose. The information will be kept confidential and is purely for tracing purposes should anyone test positive for COVID 19.

Interested parties who would like to attend Mass as part of the 10 worshippers are asked to text the <u>Parish Mobile</u> <u>0491 185 681</u> and leave the names of those desiring to attend and the day of attendance and place (St. Benedict or St. Therese). For those who are unable to text, there will also be a box at the doors of the church to place a handwritten request. There is also an option to register your interest via the Parish Facebook site. As there are only 10 worshippers a roster will be devised and worshippers notified by one of our assigned Mass coordinators. Please note that it may not be possible to give you the EXACT date you desire, but every effort will be made to accommodate you.

If you would like to act as an usher for the periods of private prayer please also contact the Parish Mobile and we can allocate you a time in the church.

It is important to note that, in line with recommendations from the Federal and State Governments and the Archdiocese that if you are an "at-risk" parishioner (the very elderly, those with any symptoms, those with compromised immune or respiratory systems) you are asked to consider carefully your health and safety when asking to attend a Church Service. The Parish acknowledges that whilst we are allowed to have worshippers in the church this comes with some risk and we will make every effort to minimise the risk to all Parishioners, especially those identified as most vulnerable. However, there also needs to be some personal responsibility taken in this matter.

According to hygiene guidelines, the church will be cleaned regularly with commercial grade disinfectant detergent.

- <u>Baptism:</u> In line with Government and Church recommendations, baptisms may be celebrated in the church with a limit of 10 attendees. If you would like to have your child baptised, please contact the Parish Office.
- <u>Weddings:</u> The Government has allowed for 10 guests (not including the bride and groom and celebrant or essential workers) to attend a wedding. All other Government and Church regulations are still applicable for weddings, e.g. Pre-marriage course, completion of appropriate paperwork, etc. For bookings, please contact the Parish Office.

As mentioned, this is a <u>trial basis only</u>. As this situation and the regulations handed down by various authorities are constantly changing, we ask for your patience and understanding at this time. This is a new and unique situation for all of us so we may find that things will change in the coming weeks. Please keep updated with the Parish Bulletin and Facebook Site. We are doing all that we can to allow you to express your faith but also need to adhere to various regulations.
