## Gradual Re-Opening of Church Activities: Stage One

As you will be aware by now the Government has announced some revised regulations in regards to places of worship. Under the new guidelines, 20 mourners are allowed at an indoor funeral, 30 for an outdoor funeral. In addition <u>religious gatherings and places of worship can have up to 10</u>
<u>worshippers at any one time.</u> In line with these new regulations and on encouragement from Archbishop Anthony Fisher, we are proposing the following to come into effect on a <u>trial basis</u>, from *Monday 18th May, 2020 at St. Gertrude's Parish*:

- <u>St. Benedict's Shrine Smithfield</u> will be open for private prayer weekdays from 9am Noon (except if a funeral is booked then precedence will be given to the Funeral Service) and from 4pm-7pm. To accommodate this there will be volunteers who will remain in the church to ensure social distancing and hygiene protocols are followed. The pews that may be used will be clearly marked. We ask that you only use those places that are marked.
- <u>Confessions</u> Monday to Saturday **4pm to 5pm**. Please note, that those wishing to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation are included in the 10 worshippers.
- Mass times at St. Benedict's will remain as they are at present:

- Mon – Fri **8pm** Mass streamed via Zoom with **Adoration at 7.30pm.** 

Saturday VigilSundaySaturdaySaturdaySam & 6pm

Mass times at St. Therese Fairfield Heights

- Mon – Fri **3pm** 

In accordance with Government guidelines, <u>each person who enters the church MUST give their</u> <u>name, telephone number and email address</u> (if they have one). There will be a sheet provided in the foyer of the church for this purpose. The information will be kept confidential and is purely for tracing purposes should anyone test positive for COVID 19.

Interested parties who would like to attend Mass as part of the 10 worshippers are asked to text the <u>Parish Mobile 0491 185 681</u> and leave the names of those desiring to attend and the day of attendance and place (St. Benedict or St. Therese). For those who are unable to text, there will also be a box at the doors of the church to place a handwritten request. There is also an option to register your interest via the Parish Facebook site. As there are only 10 worshippers a roster will be devised, and worshippers notified. Please note that it may not be possible to give you the EXACT date you desire, but every effort will be made to accommodate you.

If you would like to act as an usher for the periods of private prayer, please also contact the Parish Mobile and we can allocate you a time in the church.

According to hygiene guidelines, the church will be cleaned regularly with high grade disinfectant detergent.

- <u>Baptism</u>: In line with Government and Church recommendations, baptisms may be celebrated in the church with a limit of 10 attendees. If you would like to have your child baptised, please contact the Parish Office on 9604 1199.
- Weddings: The Government has allowed for 10 guests (not including the bride and groom and celebrant or essential workers) to attend a wedding. All other Government and Church regulations are still applicable for weddings, e.g. Pre-marriage course, completion of appropriate paperwork, etc. For bookings, please contact the Parish Office.

As mentioned, this is a <u>trial basis only</u>. As this situation and the regulations handed down by various authorities are constantly changing, we ask for your patience and understanding at this time. This is a new and unique situation for all of us so we may find that things will change in the coming weeks. Please keep updated with the Parish Bulletin and Facebook Site. We are doing all that we can to allow you to express your faith but also need to adhere to various regulations.

## **Spiritual Communion**



Catholics are encouraged to make a 'spiritual communion'. St. John Paul II writes that "it is good to cultivate in our hearts a constant desire for the sacrament of the Eucharist. This was the origin of the practice of 'spiritual communion', which has happily been established in the Church for centuries and recommended by saints who were masters of the spiritual life. Saint Teresa of Jesus wrote: 'When you do not receive communion and you do not attend Mass, you can make a spiritual communion, which is a most beneficial practice; by it the love of God will be greatly impressed on you.'" (Ecclesia Eucharistia, no. 34)

## How do I make a Spiritual Communion?

Below are recommendations for how to make a 'spiritual communion' when unable to participate in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass. The recommendations can be adapted based upon personal and family needs.

- Gather with others in your household and begin a time of prayer with the sign of the cross.
- Take time to read and reflect upon the readings from Sunday Mass
- Share prayer intentions quietly or aloud.
- Pray the Lord's Prayer.
- Pray the Act of Spiritual Communion (see below).
- Close with the sign of the cross

## **Act of Spiritual Communion**

My Jesus, I believe that you are present in the most Blessed Sacrament. I love you above all things, and I desire to receive you into my soul. Since I cannot at this moment receive you sacramentally, come at least spiritually into my heart. (Pause for a moment in silence and adoration). I embrace you as if you were already there and unite myself wholly to you. Never permit me to be separated from you. Amen.
