Weekday Mass Timetable

As restrictions gradually ease, places of worship are allowed 50 worshippers as long as social distancing can be maintained. As such, St. Therese church has a capacity of 40 worshippers only and St. Benedict's 50. For those wishing to attend weekday Mass we will return to our usual weekday timetable from last week. **There is no need to book for weekday Mass.** However, some who normally attend St. Therese at 7:00am may want to consider attending St. Benedict's 9:15am to evenly spread the number of worshippers. It is still advisable to book Mass on Sunday and preference will be given to those who have booked using the Parish Mobile number **0491 185 681.**

Ordination to Priesthood: Br. Dcn. Kazimierz Zielinski 13th June 2020.

On Saturday 13th June, at Jasna Gora in Poland, Br. Dcn. Kazimierz Zielinski was ordained to the Presbyterate. Fr. Kaziemierz was to be ordained in August in Australia, but due to the closure of borders during the current Coronavirus Pandemic and his continuing studies in Rome this was not possible and instead he was ordained at Jasna Gora. On his return to Australia sometime in the future, there will be an opportunity for all of us to celebrate as a Province. As a Parish we send our prayers and congratulations to Fr. Kazimierz and entrust his vocation to the loving arms of our Blessed Mother.

Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus

This year the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart is on **Friday 19th June**. Mass will be celebrated at 7am St. Therese and 9.15am St. Benedict's Shrine. The devotion is especially concerned with what the Church deems to be the long-suffering love and compassion of the heart of Christ towards humanity. The modern devotion to the Sacred Heart is derived from a Roman Catholic nun from France, Saint Margaret Mary Alacoque, who said she learned the devotion from Jesus during a series of apparitions to her between 1673 and 1675. Saint Gertrude the Great was an early devotee of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Book 2 of the *Herald of Divine Love* vividly describes St. Gertrude's visions, which show a considerable elaboration on the hitherto ill-defined veneration of Christ's heart. The Solemnity is traditionally celebrated the first Friday after Corpus Christi.

Immaculate Heart of the Blessed Virgin Mary

The Memorial of the Immaculate Heart will be celebrated on Saturday 20th June. Mass will be celebrated at 8am at St. Therese's church. This Memorial focuses on Mary's heart and is the an expressive symbol and the living reminder of our Blessed Mother: Mary's interior life, her joys and sorrows, her virtues and hidden perfections, and, above all, her virginal love for her God, her maternal love for her Divine Son, and her motherly and compassionate love for her sinful and miserable children here below. The history of the devotion to the Heart of Mary is connected on many points with that to the Heart of Jesus. The attention of Christians was early attracted by the love and virtues of the Heart of Mary. It is at the foot of the Cross that the Christian heart first made the acquaintance of the Heart of Mary. Simeon's prophecy paved the way and furnished the devotion with one of its favourite formulae and most popular representations: the heart pierced with a sword. But Mary was not merely passive at the foot of the Cross. St Augustine writes that Mary "cooperated through charity in the work of our redemption".

Safeguarding: The Catholic Archdiocese of Sydney have

introduced new requirements for volunteers 18yrs and over. All volunteers must sign a Volunteer Acceptance Form, a Code of Conduct for Working with Children and complete a

Safeguarding Induction Training Course.

Gradual Re-Opening of Church Activities: Stage 1.5

As you will be aware by now the Government has announced some revised regulations in regards to places of worship. Under the new guidelines, 50 mourners are allowed at funeral. In addition, <u>religious gatherings and places of worship can have up to 50 worshippers</u> at any one time, as long as they maintain social distancing regulations. In line with these new regulations and on encouragement from Archbishop Anthony Fisher, in his *Sixth Pastoral Letter* we are proposing the following to come into effect on a <u>trial basis</u>, from <u>Weekend of 7th June, 2020</u> at *St. Gertrude's Parish*:

• St. Benedict's Shrine Smithfield will be open for private prayer weekdays from 9am – Noon (except if a funeral is booked then precedence will be given to the Funeral Service) and from 4pm-7pm. To accommodate this there will be volunteers who will remain in the church to ensure social distancing and hygiene protocols are followed. The pews that may be used will be clearly marked with a yellow X. We ask that you only use those places that are marked.

• <u>Confessions</u> Wednesday 7:30pm.

Saturday 4:45pm to 5:45pm

Please note, that those wishing to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation are included in the 50 worshippers.

In accordance with Government guidelines, <u>each person who enters the church MUST give their name, telephone number and/or email address</u> (if they have one). There will be a sheet provided in the foyer of the church for this purpose. The information will be kept confidential and is purely for tracing purposes should anyone test positive for COVID 19. It is not necessary to book for weekday Mass, however, to ensure a place on the weekend please telephone or text the Parish Mobile 0491 185 681. Preference of places will be given to those who have prebooked.

The Archbishop has continued the dispensation of Sunday Mass for those who are ill or unable to attend Mass.

It is important to note that, in line with recommendations from the Federal and State Governments and the Archdiocese that if you are an "at-risk" parishioner (those over 70 years of age, those with any symptoms, those with compromised immune or respiratory systems), are asked to consider carefully your health and safety when considering attending a Church Service. The Parish acknowledges that whilst we are allowed to have worshippers in the church this comes with some risk and we will make every effort to minimise the risk to all Parishioners, especially those identified as most vulnerable. However, there also needs to be some personal responsibility taken in this matter.

If you are unwell, we ask that you refrain from attending church at this time.

- <u>Baptism</u>: In line with Government and Church recommendations, baptisms may be celebrated in the church with a limit of 50 attendees. If you would like to have your child baptised, please contact the Parish Office.
- <u>Weddings:</u> The Government has allowed for 20 guests (not including the bride and groom and celebrant or essential workers) to attend a wedding. All other Government and Church regulations are still applicable for weddings, e.g. Pre-marriage course, completion of appropriate paperwork, etc. For bookings, please contact the Parish Office.

According to hygiene guidelines, the church will be cleaned regularly with commercial grade disinfectant detergent.
