What did Mother Teresa do?

She was the founder of the order of missionaries of charity.

On October 7, 1950, Mother Teresa received permission from the Holy See to start her own order, "The Missionaries of Charity", whose primary task was to love and care for those persons nobody was prepared to look after. In 1965 the Society became an International Religious Family by decree of Pope Paul VI.

Mother Teresa not only fought poverty by serving the poor in filthy streets, but she also accepted it in her own life by giving up all of her material possessions and physical comfort. She was aware that there are three types of poverty: material, spiritual, and virtuous poverty.

Mother Teresa was a Roman Catholic nun who dedicated her life to serving the poor and needy. She lived for a long time in Calcutta, India, where she formed the Missionaries of Charity, a religious order dedicated to assisting those in need.

If you look at all her humanitarian efforts, her motivations are clear as day. Soup kitchens, a leper colony, orphanages, and a home for the dying indigent were all established by her. She fed the homeless, healed lepers, and taught the poorest of the poor. She treated them as if they were members of her family.

Mother Teresa was also a charismatic leader. She inspired people in the world to help the ones who need help without seeing their status or races. ... Among Mother Teresa's great strengths was her relentless focus on the core mission of her organization -- helping the poorest of the poor, and she taught us what universal love is.
